

Development of Syntax in Young Children

Lexical Verb Development

As reported by parents on the Communicative Developmental Inventory (CDI) (Fenson, et. Al, 2007):

Age in Months	Mean # of unique verbs
21 months	10
24	37
27	85

Mean growth rate of 8 verbs/month (Hadley, Rispoli & Hsu, 2013)

Unique Subject Verb (USV)

Within 40 minutes of parent-toddler interaction (Hadley, 2014):

Age in Months	Mean # of USVs
21	2
24	8
27	24

Different combinations of sentence subjects and verbs increased from less than one every 10 min to more than one every 2 min during this 6-month period.

Developmental Sequence of USV:

- Sentences with first person subjects (i.e., I-sentences)
- Third person singular sentences (i.e., other-sentences)
- Second person and plural subjects

At 24 and 27 months of age, 50% and 70% of the toddlers produced at least two USVs with both first and third person singular subjects. By 30 months of age, 100% of the toddlers in this database produced at least two USVs with both first and third person singular subjects (DeKalb cohort raw data).

Tense Agreement (T/A)

The average toddler produces approximately two different T/A morphemes in 1 hr. of conversational language sampling at 24 months of age, increasing to nearly 10 sufficiently different uses of T/A morphemes by 30 months (Hadley, 2014).

By age 30 months:

100% of children in study	90% children in study	70% of children
➤ 1 T/A	➤ 3 T/A	➤ 5 T/A

Developmental Sequence (Rispoli, 2012)

- Copula BE (specifically is)
- Third person singular –s, –ed
- Auxiliary DO as a set
- Auxiliary BE
