## **Functional Language Development Hierarchy**

**Internal Sense of Self:** Uses language to reflect internally on how actions affect others/self

**Comparative Thinking**: Can compare/contrast events/books

Multi-Causal Thinking: Uses language to problem solve, express past/present, connect actions to emotions

**Analytic/Logical Thinking:** Using language to pretend, answer Wh?, ask why?

Creative Use of Ideas and Symbols: Using words to express needs and label items

**Shared Social Problem Solving:** 50+ circles of communicational exchanges with gestures and turn taking

**Simple Two Way Gesturing:** follows eye gaze of others, communicates with shared attention, looks at choices, likes cause/effect toys

**Engaging and Relating:** shares attention to objects, cooing and smiling with caregiver, exhibits shared sense of emotion with others

Being calm and interested in the world: Will move to look at caregiver's face, shared attention, calm and regulated
